C.17 Convocation Academic Matters July 1, 2012

# AURORA COLLEGE

## POLICY

Aurora College shall hold convocation ceremonies at each campus for students who successfully complete the requirements for Aurora College programs leading to a certificate, diploma or degree.

### PRINCIPLES

1. Convocation is a public recognition of the successful completion of the specified requirements for certificate, diploma, and degree programs as stated in the Aurora College Program Outlines.

### PROCEDURES

- 1. One convocation ceremony will be held at each campus annually.
- 2. A student who successfully meets his/her program completion requirements, and who has achieved a cumulative average of "C" (60%) or higher prior to convocation shall be recognized at convocation. (see Policy C.24)
- 3. Due to scheduling constraints, convocation may take place before the end of term (i.e. while students are taking classes or doing practicums/internships). Students who are enrolled in their final term and who are expected to complete their program successfully immediately following convocation may participate in the convocation ceremony.
- 4. A student will participate in convocation only once per document of recognition.
- 5. A student who does not participate in convocation with his/her original class is encouraged to participate in a future Aurora College convocation once all program requirements have been successfully completed. The student may participate in a convocation ceremony at any Aurora College campus.
- 6. A student must be in good standing financially with the College in order to participate in convocation.
- 7. Certificates, diplomas, degrees, and transcripts will not be issued until all accounts with the College have been paid.
- 8. It is the student's responsibility to pay for travel to attend convocation.

9. The Director, Aurora Campus or the Vice President(s) of the College may choose to recognize non-certificate, non-diploma, and non-degree graduates during convocation ceremonies at his/her discretion. Academic regalia (any combination of gown, hood, stole and mortarboard) should not be worn by those participants.
