BACK TO FACE TO FACE IN 2021-2022

We are working hard to get ready to welcome students back for face-to-face learning...

While the 2020-2021 academic year was challenging for students, we are excited to be returning to face-to-face classes in the fall. We are still planning for COVID safety precautions so the fall will not quite be like it was pre-pandemic, however, having you back in our classrooms safely is what we are planning for.

What will be different next year?

Currently, we are approved for up to 30 in most classrooms. However, if within those classes there is not enough space for 6 feet between students, you will need to wear a mask in class. You will also be required to do a COVID check-in each time you enter our campuses. Masks will be required within our campuses. Campus-wide or large group activities will comply with the public health orders in effect during the year and we will adjust as they change.

ONLINE REGISTRATIONS OPEN JULY 5

Online registrations happen on MYAC Self-Service...

Course registration for the fall is completed online through MYAC Self-Service. If you have not already, make sure you are able to login to MYAC Self-Service (<https://bit.ly/3v8UcXv>). If you are having issues logging in, please email helpdesk@auroracollege.nt.ca for some assistance.

You will receive an email from your program informing you which courses you need to register in as well as instructions on how to register. After you register, your program head or senior instructor will review your courses and approve them. Once they are approved, your tuition and fees will appear on your account in MYAC Self-Service. You can pay these immediately.

ALBE, OCAP, and UCAP students will register a little later in the summer.

DO YOU NEED HOUSING?

Have you applied for student housing? We have begun to process housing applications and are assigning residence units. You should expect to hear whether you have housing and which unit in the next few weeks.

If you have not applied for student housing but want to, please email us.

Each unit is different and it is best to ask us for information before you come.

Residence fees are billed by the term (e.g. Fall, Winter, Spring). We prefer students to pay for the full term however if you want to pay monthly you will need to sign a simple payment plan.

HAVE YOU APPLIED FOR SFA YET?

Deadline is June 30th for most programs...

If you have not applied for Student Financial Assistance yet, the deadline is June 30th. If you apply after June 30th, you may be starting out the year without funding. If you apply by June 30th and are approved for SFA, you will have your funding in time for the beginning of the school year.

You must submit a Form D to us as part of the process to receive funding. You can get a Form D from the SFA website at <https://bit.ly/39QIMzN>

Please complete the top portion of the Form D and then submit it to the Admissions Officer at your campus. We must submit these to SFA on August 7th (July 7th for ENRTP Yr1 and July 16th for ENRTP Yr 2). If we do not have your Form D before this date, your funding will be delayed.

DON'T FORGET - THIS IS IMPORTANT

WHAT IF I OWE MONEY TO AURORA COLLEGE?

You must pay off your outstanding balance...

If you have an outstanding balance with Aurora College, you must pay it off before the beginning of the academic year. You will not be permitted to carry forward any balances from previous years into the next academic year.

If you have an outstanding balance:

- You will not be able to receive any parchments or transcripts from Aurora College.
- You will not be able to register for the Fall or move into residence.
- Your acceptance may be cancelled and your seat awarded to someone on the waitlist.

Can I sign a payment plan if I have an outstanding balance?

No. You cannot pay off outstanding balances from previous years on a payment plan. Please contact your campus finance manager if you have questions.

HOW MUCH WILL SCHOOL COST ME?

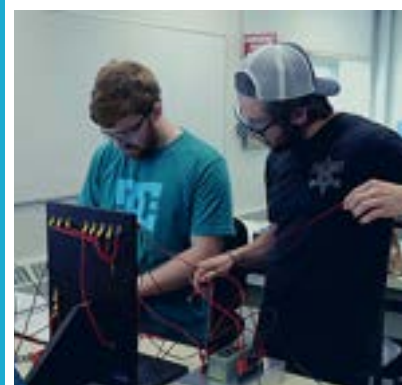
Every program is a little different...

For most programs, tuition is \$1800 per term for full-time students. Some programs have a fall and winter term only. However, programs such as the Bachelor of Science in Nursing, Personal Support Worker, Early Learning and Child Care, and Practical Nursing also have a spring term. For students in the first year of the Environment and Natural Resources Technology program, tuition is \$2400 for the fall term only. Please ask to confirm if your program is two or three terms.

Students are also required to pay fees for each term. This includes a \$100 per term technology fee for use and access to all of the systems available to you as a student (ex. online library research, Grammarly, Office 365, and more), Students are also required to pay a \$25 recreation fee as well as a \$25 student association fee. The student association fee is not paid in the spring term.
