#### PURPOSE

This policy outlines the requirements for honour roll and graduating with distinction.

### SCOPE AND LIMITS

This policy applies to certificate, diploma and degree programs.

The Office of the Registrar decides honour roll based on full-time student enrollment, the completion of a minimum of 60% of the course load in any given year while maintaining an 83% average in their program of study, and having no final course grade below 65%. The exception to this course load applies to students with disabilities who have self-identified. Students must be free of formally substantiated academic or non-academic misconduct offences to be considered for the honour roll.

Graduating with distinction includes any student who successfully completes required courses and any required learning activities in a program or as otherwise stated in the program outline, maintains an overall average of 83%, and has no final course grade below 65% and no failed courses.

The College will not release any academic document of recognition until such time as all outstanding student fees and accounts have been deemed to be paid.

#### **POLICY STATEMENT**

This policy recognizes the outstanding academic achievement of students and graduates through honour roll and graduating with distinction based on course work completed towards a credential.

### **Guiding Principles**

1. To enhance the student experience, recognize achievement, and encourage the pursuit of academic excellence through a celebration of learning by awarding honour roll and graduating with distinction.

#### DEFINITIONS

**Graduating with Distinction:** To achieve graduating with distinction, students must have an 83% average after the completion of the required courses and learning activities in a program and have no final course grade below 65% and no failed courses.

**Honour Roll:** To achieve honour roll status, students must be registered as a full-time student, carry a minimum of 60% of the 100% course load while maintaining an annual average of 83% in their program of study, and have no final course grade below 65%.
